{ MUMBAI TRAIN MURDER }

Cop set to retire, trader among killed

NEW DELHI: A 57-year-old police officer just months from retirement, a 60-year-old shopkeeper, a man in his early 40s, and a 48-year-old worker. These were the four victims of an armed 33-year-old Railway Protection Force (RPF) constable, Chetan Singh, who shot dead his senior officer and three passengers on board the Jaipur-Mumbai Central Superfast Express as it moved through suburban Mumbai on Monday morning.

Assistant sub-inspector Tikaram Meena, 57:
An affable man, Meena was just nine months from retirement, say his colleagues in RPF. He was posted at Dadar and often travelled on long-distance trains, leading RPF escort teams. A few years ago, Meena was left badly injured after a thief he was trying to catch attacked him. While Meena's wife and son live in Sawai Madhopur, his daughter and son-in-law, who is a station master, live in Titwala on the outskirts of Mumbai. Meena's colleagues said he was a gentle and peaceable man. It was difficult to think of him as getting into any altercations, they said, adding that they had never seen him angry.

Abdul Kadar Hussain Bhanpurwala, 60:
Bhanpurwala had gone to his village near Jaipur to mark 10 days of Muharram. A resident of Bohri Colony at Achale, Nalasopara in suburban Mumbai, Bhanpurwala ran a shop in the locality selling diapers. His wife and children are in Dubai at the moment, said relatives. "He couldn't accompany them on account of his health so he decided to go to our village for Muharram," said his younger brother Ali Azghar. "We received a call from Government Railway Police (GRP) officers at 7am about his death and rushed

Railway panel to probe killings
NEW DELHI: The railway board on Monday formed a high-level committee to probe the killing of four people on a Jaipur-Mumbai train by Railway Protection Force (RPF) officer Chetan Singh.
"A high-level committee, headed by ADG (RPF) is constituted to conduct a comprehensive enquiry into the incident and also inquire about any previous brawls involving the accused," chief public relations officer of western Railways said. **HTC**

to Shatabdi Hospital. His family is coming back to Mumbai tomorrow," he added. One of Bhanpurwala's neighbours at the Bohri society said he lived there for the last 22 years and was the secretary of their housing society. "He was a simple and down-to-earth man, all of us are in great shock," the neighbour said, requesting that his identity not be revealed.

Azgar Abbas Ali, 48: Ali, who was Chetan Singh's last victim on the train, was on his way to Mumbai to join a new workplace. He previously worked at a bangle-making unit near Hawa Mahal, Jaipur. "I was expecting a call on Monday morning to say that he had arrived, instead I got a call from the police telling me of his death," said Amanullah Shaikh, his youngest brother who works at a zari-making unit in Mumbai. Ali, he added, was expected to join work in Madanpura.

Sadar Mohd Hussain Singh's fourth victim, who was shot dead in the pantry car of the train, has been identified as Sadar Mohammed Hussain, according to news agency PTI. A bearded man in his forties, Hussain was travelling alone and no one stepped forward to claim his body till the time of going to press. He was not carrying any papers and we could only recover ₹250 from his pocket, said a GRP officer.

How cop killed 4 on train

An armed RPF constable on board Jaipur-Mumbai Central Superfast Express shot dead four people as the train moved through suburban Mumbai on Monday morning. A look at the sequence of events:

1 5.18-5.35am: As train crosses Vaitarna, Singh, after killing Meena, moves into the B5 coach, where he shoots another passenger, Abdul Kadarbhai Mohammad Hussain Bhanpurwala, dead. He then moves towards the pantry car located between B5 and B4, and kills Sadar Mohammed Hussain. He then moves to S6, passing B4 to B1, and kills Asghar Ali before going on a hate-filled rant.

3 5.40am: A passenger pulls the alarm chain, when the train is between Mira Road and Dahisar stations, during which Singh disembarks the train.

4 5.50am: As he runs on the tracks, RPF and GRP personnel, who were alerted, nab him. At Borivali station, passengers from S6 and B5 coaches are disembarked; the train proceeds and reaches Mumbai Central station at 8.07am

Accused almost alighted before attack

MUMBAI: Railway Protection Force (RPF) constable Chetan Singh, who shot dead his senior colleague and three passengers on board the Jaipur-Mumbai Central Express on Monday, was short-tempered and had complained of uneasiness on the day of the incident, officials said, adding that there was a point when he was meant to be taken off duty but later said he felt fine.

The communication between Singh's team and the RPF control room could hold clues as to what transpired before railway cops opened fire at four people

after which it was decided to replace him at the next stoppage at Vapi, another half an hour away. RPF assistant sub-inspector Tikaram Meena, who was leading the team, informed the control room about the need to relieve Singh from escort duty and send a replacement at Vapi, where the train halts for barely two minutes. A senior western railway official told HT that one of team members from Meena's team even took the automatic rifle from Singh as it was to be handed over to the replacement. "However, what we understand is that Singh then told the team that he was feeling fine and will continue. This is why the replacement never happened," the official said.

Singh, who originally hailed from Hathras in Uttar Pradesh, grew up in Ratlam in Madhya Pradesh. The 33-year-old got a job with the Railway Protection Force in December 2009 on compassionate grounds after the death of his father Bachhu Singh, who served as an assistant sub-inspector in the force. Singh was on a 12-day personal leave recently and resumed work on July 18. Singh's family members include his wife, two minor children and his mother.

Baghel releases ₹31 cr as unemployment aid

RAIPUR: The young population of Chhattisgarh now have access to skill development training as well as job opportunities, chief minister Bhupesh Baghel said on Monday while transferring the fourth instalment of the state's unemployment allowance scheme amounting to ₹31.71 crore to the accounts of 122,000 beneficiaries.

A total amount of ₹112.43 crore has been transferred so far to the accounts of the beneficiaries, officials said. During the programme, Baghel symbolically handed over job offer letters to beneficiaries who have completed their skill development training.

"It is our priority to connect the youth of the state with employment and we are making consistent and consolidated efforts to make it happen. The MoU (memorandum of understanding) for a project worth ₹1,188.36 crore for modernization of 36 ITIs (industrial training institutes) of the state has been signed, and with the implementation of this project, youngsters

Bhupesh Baghel will be provided training in six new technical trades as well as 23 short term courses," Baghel said. "Completion of this project will facilitate skill development training to nearly 10,000 youth every year." "We have fulfilled our promises to the public. As soon as the ban on recruitment was lifted, we released the advertisements for recruitment on government jobs," the chief minister added. **HTC**

ISRO GENERATES GEOSPATIAL DATA FOR 232 TOWNS

NEW DELHI: The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has generated geospatial database for over 230 towns across the country as part of the government's Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) to help urban planners develop infrastructure projects in the coming years.

A senior official of ISRO said, "The original plan was to generate data for 500 towns and out of this we have managed to submit database for 232 towns. The information generated by our satellites will help the government agencies plan dedicated infrastructure projects for these towns. This will include improving roads, railway and inland routes along with developing our local infrastructure," the official said.

ISRO officials said this project has multiple agencies that will be partnering with the Union ministry of housing and urban affairs (MoHUA).

{ MODI MEET WITH NDA LAWMAKERS }

'INDIA won't get support of public'

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday hit out at the Opposition alliance that has renamed itself as INDIA, saying the collective may have changed its name, but it would not be able to secure the support of people who "continue to see the grouping as corrupt".

Modi made the comment during a meeting with a group of NDA lawmakers in Delhi, where he said the opposition leaders has realised that they will not be able to "undo the sins" of the past or shed the "burden of their sins" so they opted to change their name, a Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) functionary present at the meeting said, asking not to be named.

According to this person, Modi said: "...the alliance wants to wash off the sins of the past and they have realised that people of the country have only hatred towards them. So, they want to leave behind their old identity." "The PM also said that the NDA was formed for a cause and not selfish reasons," said a

second leader. The leader said the PM cited the example of how the NDA chose to make Nitish Kumar the chief minister of Bihar even though the JDU had fewer seats than the BJP in the 2020 assembly elections. The PM's meeting comes ahead of the assembly elections in five states later this year and the 2024 general election.

Urging lawmakers to maintain direct contact with people in their constituencies, Modi is leant to have said that there should be amplification of the achievements of the central and BJP governments in the states.

"He said while we talk about national and international issues, we must ensure focus is on the achievements of the government and now the lives of those who were at the bottom of the socioeconomic structure have benefited," the functionary quoted above said. The MPs have also been asked to continue the samapark se samarthan programme wherein senior leaders call on prominent people in their constituencies to talk about the government's achievements. **HTC**
